

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY ELECTIVE PROGRAMMES

The School of Pharmacy is offering elective courses for Pharmacy students as well as students from other health-related fields from outside the University of Ghana. Elective courses are available in each of the five Departments of the School namely: Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmaceutics and Microbiology, Pharmacognosy and Herbal Medicine, Pharmacology and Toxicology, and Pharmacy Practice and Clinical Pharmacy.

Each elective will span between 4 to 6 weeks and will entail didactic approaches, experiential sessions and field trips.

Elective Courses

1. Electives are usually available in any of the following departments of interest to the applicants:

3. Applications must be accompanied by a recommendation from applicant's Dean for further processing of the application
4. A non-refundable administrative/registration fee of US\$150 is charged while the mentorship fee is \$115/week of study. Students are required by University Policy to make full payment of their fees in US Dollars
5. Fees are payable by a successful applicant upon arrival in the School at the Cash Office at the School's Administration Block.
6. Limited accommodation is available (paired rooms) at **the International Students Hostel (ISH)**.

7. The current charge of accommodation is US\$18 per day per student. Meals are available at canteens and restaurants on campus.
8. **Malpractice/liability insurance:**
You will not be covered for malpractice insurance by the University Of Ghana School Of Pharmacy. You need your own personal medical insurance.
9. Students would be appraised based on a brief assessment and evaluation (pre-course and post-course evaluation) of the programme after which a certificate of participation would be awarded to students.
10. The University's code of conduct would be made available to guide students abide by the University's regulation.

NOTE: The success of a student's application will depend, on whether the Heads of relevant Departments are able to accept applicants bearing in mind available (running) student rotations.
